

Rochester Bridge Trust Spence Agricultural Scholarship

The Spence Agricultural Scholarship will grant the recipient £5,000 a year for three or four consecutive years, whilst studying for their degrees. The scholarship has been launched in recognition of the work of John Spence, a former Senior Warden of the Trust.

Scholars must pass each year of study at their first attempt and provide a brief report (500 words) to the Rochester Bridge Trust on their academic and other achievements during the previous academic year by the 30th June each year. Failure to do so could result in the removal of the award for subsequent years.

The Scholarship is available to students studying for a BSc Hons in an agriculture-based subject as set out in the Trust's Grant Policy (agriculture, including viticulture and horticultural food production) at university.

The qualifying areas are: Medway, Kent, London Boroughs of Bexley and Bromley, Cambridgeshire, Lincolnshire and West Yorkshire. Students must live or study in one of these areas at the time of their application.
