



Rochester Bridge Trust Harriott Engineering Scholarship

The Harriott Engineering Scholarship will grant the recipient £300 a year for two consecutive years, while studying for their A-Levels or IB Diploma. The scholarship has been launched in recognition of the work of Paul Harriott, a former long-standing member of the Court of Wardens and Assistants, serving as both Junior and Senior Warden during his four decades with the Trust.

The scholarship is available to students currently studying at a **non-fee paying non-selective school**, intending to study A-Levels in maths and physics and/or design and technology. Students intending to study for the IB Diploma are also eligible, but must be taking a higher-level mathematics course.

The qualifying areas are: the historic county of Kent (including Medway). Students must live or study in one of these areas at the time of their application.

Please complete the attached form and return it to the Rochester Bridge Trust with one of the following, explaining why you wish to study engineering and how you might use the scholarship:

- a one-minute supporting video;
- a short PowerPoint presentation (max. 10 pages); or
- a poster

Alternatively, students may submit a relevant learning project from their maths, physics or design & technology education in the current academic year – if the project is ongoing, please include a synopsis of the overall project. This includes CREST projects but should only consist of selected pages relevant to engineering, please do not send in the complete project.

All presentations must not have transitions or videos embedded in them. Any presentations containing these elements will be deemed an incomplete application.

A supporting recommendation from a science, technology, engineering or maths teacher must also be received by the Trust alongside the application. The teacher recommendation should be sent directly from the teacher's school email address to scholarships@rbt.org.uk

Home educated applicants are welcome to apply but will not be entitled to the additional one-off £400 financial award intended for supporting schools. All other eligibility criteria apply. In lieu of a teacher recommendation, a supporting recommendation must be received from a formal out of school activity/group leader, including, but not limited to, Scouting/Guiding, cadets, or theatre/performing arts instructors, where attendance is regular.

Scholars must provide a brief report (500 words) to the Rochester Bridge Trust on their academic and other achievements during the previous academic year by 30 June each year. Failure to do so could result in the removal of the award for subsequent years.
